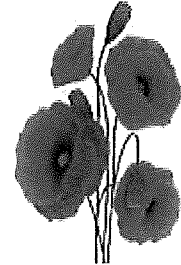


Remembrance Day Ceremony—November 11, 1:00 pm

THE BEAR FACTS: Help Wanted!

Response needed! This year is unfolding into a bad year for conflicts between people and bears; bears are losing. Conservation officers monitor and respond to wildlife conflicts, given their mandate and protocols for public safety and environmental stewardship. This fall, conservation officers have killed several black bears in Telkwa, including two lone adults and a family group. All of these bears were involved in conflicts associated with peoples' improperly managed attractants, including garbage, fruit trees, and bird feeders. Recent reports indicate that two more black bears were roaming the Woodland Subdivision area—and may still be when this reaches you. A more peaceful way of living with bears is for people to work together to prevent these kinds of problems from happening in the first place. Don't give bears incentives to interact with people in hazardous ways. Most conflicts are preventable. **Please minimize odors that attract bears and remove or secure garbage and other attractants to keep bears out.** For more information about preventing conflicts with bears visit the Living with Wildlife Foundation (www.lwwf.org) and WildSafeBC (<https://wildsafebc.com/>) websites.
