The Bear Facts: It Takes a Community to Keep Bears Wild

Bear Facts reminder: This is the season when bear-human conflicts are the most common in the valley. Remove or secure attractants so that bears do not get human sources of food. Some major attractants include apples and other domestic fruits; bird, pet, and livestock foods; and attractants in garbage and poorly managed compost, and on dirty barbecues. **Also note:** Conservation Officer Kevin Nixon reports, "of interest is: an adult cougar that has been seen numerous times in the Woodland and Cottonwood subdivisions." **For information** about preventing conflicts and staying safe around bears, cougars and other wildlife visit: **Province of B.C. 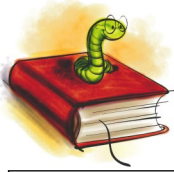
