






# Recycling will significantly reduce your garbage.

Buy a large recycling cart from the Village of Telkwa for \$35 plus GST and fill it with Accepted Materials for weekly pickup.

## Did you know?

In British Columbia, single-stream curbside recycling is uniform throughout the province.

This standardization stems from the BC Recycling Regulation implemented in 2004.

Recycle BC is the sole industry organization responsible for overseeing community recycling efforts, which fosters robust end markets and enhances economies of scale.

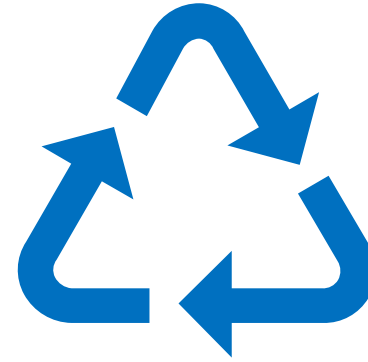


## How much have we recycled through weekly curbside collection?

---

Since curbside recycling data was collected in April 2022, a total of 97.19 Metric Tonnes (9,719 kg) have been collected. The number is much higher for all recycling when we add in material brought to the Transfer Station and Bottle Depot.

# What happens to recycling picked up at the curb?

- Some rumours suggest that recycling ends up in landfills or worse, but that is not accurate.
- Recycling carts from the curbside are collected by the Village of Telkwa truck, and once full, the materials are taken to the Witset Recycling Facility managed by E360S.
- There, the materials are baled, weighed, and then transferred onto a larger truck for transportation to their final markets.
